The community of Friday Harbor is located on San Juan Island which is accessible by way of the Washington State Ferries traveling a 35-mile stretch of water from the gateway community of Anacortes, WA. The remoteness of this small, rural high school of 259 students allows the community to be a strong supporter of the only public high school which is an offspring of it's more than 8,630 year-round residents. As a seasonal tourist destination, Friday Harbor has a large middle class made up of retired as well as working class citizens. It has been noted as having one of the lowest earned income levels and highest educational levels of any county in the state of Washington. (Per capita income for the county \$45,777). Band Families & Friends, SJI Service Scholarship, Purple & Gold Booster Club and San Juan Public Schools Foundation are a sampling of some community based organizations that participate in the success of our student body.

Over 60% of our student body participate in athletic opportunities at FHHS in one or more of the thirteen seasonal varsity sports or cheer leading. We maintain membership with WIAA in the Northwest 1A/2B League. Through a sound financial partnership with a local tax district known as San Juan Island Park and Recreation sports hold a prominent and secure future for our student body.

Club activities include Associated Student Body, Key Club, National Honor Society, LatinX, Advocacy Club, and more. An annual high school play is performed each year which is financially supported by and performed in our beautiful community theater.

The school of Friday Harbor High is a college prep high school with nearly 90% of graduated students attending either a 4-year university, a 2-year community college or technical school.

Our campus network brings technology and computer access to all classrooms and to our three computer labs. In 2022-23 our STEM building was updated with a new art center. The state-of-art facility is on the shared high school and middle
