

Frequently asked questions about open enrollment and PEBB Medicare plans

Note: This is a general FAQ. Not all questions and answers may apply to your account.

Why are the open enrollment dates changing?

There were concerns about challenges making open enrollment changes at the end of November and during the Thanksgiving holiday. To make sure you have help and support from HCA when making changes, the PEBB Program is moving open enrollment to October 28 through November 25, 2024.

Do my PEBB monthly premiums include Medicare Part B?

No. The PEBB monthly premiums are separate from the Medicare Part B premium you pay through Medicare (Social Security Administration). The 2025 monthly premiums listed in your customized letter are in addition to your Medicare Part B monthly premiums. For questions about your Medicare Part B premiums, please contact the Social Security Administration.

Is UMP Classic Medicare plan going away?

No. The UMP Classic Medicare plan is not going away, but it is changing. Beginning January 1, 2025, the UMP Classic Medicare plan's prescription drug benefit will change to a Medicare Part D plan. The medical coverage will stay the same. You must have a physical street address within the U.S. or its territories to stay enrolled in this plan. All Medicare enrollees who are enrolled in UMP Classic Medicare as of December 31, 2024, who permanently live outside of the U.S. and do not make an election during the PEBB annual open enrollment in 2024 will be automatically deferred from PEBB retiree insurance coverage effective January 1, 2025.

What changes are happening to the Kaiser Medicare plan options?

- Kaiser Permanente NW Senior Advantage: This plan is changing from Medicare
 Advantage to Medicare Advantage plus Medicare Part D. The name will change to
 Kaiser Permanente NW Senior Advantage with Part D. The medical benefits will stay
 the same, but there may be lower copays for prescription drugs. This plan covers the
 same benefits as Original Medicare Part A and Part B, as well as benefits and services
 that Medicare doesn't cover.
- Kaiser Permanente WA Original Medicare: This plan will no longer be offered in Benton, Columbia, Franklin, Walla Walla, Whitman, Yakima, and Mason County ZIP code 98560. Members in these counties must choose a new plan.
- Kaiser Permanente WA Medicare Advantage: This plan is changing from Medicare
 Advantage to Medicare Advantage plus Medicare Part D. The name will change to
 Kaiser Permanente WA Medicare Advantage with Part D. The medical benefits will stay
 the same, but there may be lower copays for prescription drugs. This plan covers the
 same benefits as Original Medicare Part A and Part B, as well as benefits and services
 that Medicare doesn't cover.

What are other Medicare plan options?

Aside from your current PEBB medical plan, you can choose to enroll in any of the plans listed in your customized letter. If you change plans during the PEBB open enrollment (October 28 through November 25, 2024), your new plan will begin January 1, 2025.

In addition to UMP Classic Medicare with Part D (PDP), these PEBB Medicare plans are available nationwide. These plans let you choose your own doctor and live anywhere in the U.S. They provide coverage anywhere in the U.S. and for medical emergencies while traveling internationally.

- Premera Blue Cross Medicare Supplement Plan G: Does not include Medicare Part D
 prescription drug coverage. This is a Medicare Supplement plan and covers only
 Medicare-approved services. It does not cover prescription drugs. For prescription
 drug coverage, retirees may enroll in a Medicare Part D plan outside the PEBB
 Program.
- UnitedHealthcare PEBB Balance: Includes Medicare Part D prescription drug coverage (also called an MAPD plan). This is a Medicare Advantage plan that covers the same benefits as Original Medicare Part A and Part B, as well as benefits and services that Medicare does not cover, including non-emergency services while traveling internationally.
- **UnitedHealthcare PEBB Complete:** Includes Medicare Part D prescription drug coverage (also called an MAPD plan). This is a Medicare Advantage plan that covers the same benefits as Original Medicare Part A and Part B, as well as benefits and services that Medicare does not cover, including non-emergency services while traveling internationally.

How can I compare PEBB Medicare plans?

The table below helps you compare some benefits under the different types of Medicare plans offered by the PEBB Program. All PEBB Medicare plans cover hospital, primary and specialty care, outpatient surgery, and emergency care.

If I enroll in a PEBB Medicare Advantage plan with Part D, can I return to another plan later?

Yes. You can change your medical plan during a future PEBB annual open enrollment for coverage effective the following year. You can also change your medical plan during a special open enrollment if you have a qualifying life event (such as marriage or moving out of a plan's service area). Generally, to make a change due to a special open enrollment, you must submit the *PEBB Retiree Change Form* (form E) and any other required forms or documents. The PEBB Program must receive the information **no later than 60 days** after the event that created the special open enrollment.

Will I be able to see the same providers with another medical plan?

Each medical plan's provider network varies, and some plans allow you to see any provider and still receive coverage if the provider accepts Medicare. Contact the medical plans directly or visit their websites for more information. You can find their phone numbers and information in your customized letter.

Will my prescription drugs be covered if I change PEBB Medicare plans, and at what cost?

Plan G does not provide prescription drug coverage. All other PEBB Medicare plans do include prescription drug coverage, but the plans' formularies (list of covered prescription drugs) vary, as well as the cost-sharing for each drug tier. Contact the medical plans directly or visit their websites for more information.
