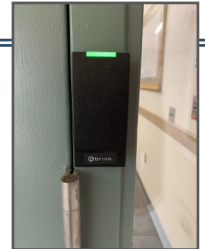
We are proud to have kept our levy promises to our community.

Technology investments:

- ◆ Purchased close to 1700 devices for student use,
- ◆ Replaced all staff devices with new mobile laptops and school projectors,
- ◆ Purchased e-subscriptions for students and staff, and
- ◆ Updated and reconfigured our network infrastructure to provide faster, more secure computing across the district.

Facility upgrades:

- ◆ Cardlock systems at the middle and high schools,
- ◆ New entry security at the elementary school,
- ◆ Renovations of fire suppression systems at the middle school and elementary, and alarms at the high school,
- ◆ Increased energy conservation through the installation of LED lighting,
- ◆ Improved award winning food service program through kitchen upgrades.
- ◆ Remodeled high school library, elementary science room and portions of the STEM building,
- ◆ Repaired the high school roof,
- ◆ Remodeled the Turnbull Gym locker-room, and
- ◆ Installed outdoor reader board at the corner of Guard St. and Blair Ave.
