BACK-TO-SCHOOL IMMUNIZATION FAQS!

Do I have to make an appointment?

Yes. Registration is required. You can sign up for an appointment online or call our office for assistance. Scan the QR on the flyer or go to our website <u>www.sanjuancountywa.gov/2075/Clinics</u> to sign up for a clinic. If you are unable to schedule online or have questions, call office and we are happy to help! Our number is 360-378-4474.

Which vaccines does my child need?

Our public health nurses are able to look up which vaccines your child needs before their appointment. However, if this is your child's first immunization in Washington state, please bring their immunization history with you to their appointment.

Can my child(ren) get their flu and/or COVID-19 immunization at one of these clinics?

What do I need to bring to the appointment?

If your child(ren) received immunizations in another state or country, please bring those records with you to your appointment. Our nurses only have access to Washington state records.

Which immunizations are required for school?

Information about immunization requirements are available on our <u>website</u>, or you can go <u>www.doh.wa.gov/SCCI</u>.

Do I have to come with my child(ren) to their appointment?

Yes. We require parent or guardian consent for all immunizations.

My child is scared of needles. What can I do to help prepare them for their appointment?

If you have specific questions or need accommodations, please don't hesitate to call and ask to speak with one of our public health nurses so we can help support you and your child during the appointment. Our office phone number is 360-378-4474.

No. These clinics are only for routine immunizations. We will have flu and COVID-19 immunization clinics in the fall.

I have questions about a vaccine. Who do I speak to?

Call our main office at 360-378-4474 and ask to speak with a public health nurse and they will be happy to answer any questions you have! You can also ask questions during your child's appointment.

Where are these clinics happening?

The clinics will be at the Health & Community Services building by the post office at 145 Rhone St. If the weather is nice, then the clinics will be in our Luci B Community Wellness Van (pictured below)!



I don't speak English. How can I speak to the nurse before or during the appointment?

We believe that everyone has a right to receive comprehensive information about any medical service for themselves or their child(ren). Our office has phone interpreters available when you call our office, at every appointment, and signage displayed informing patients of their right to interpretative services.

What does it cost?

As of June 1, 2023, HCS collects fees for vaccine administration and office visits. **No one will be denied services because of inability to pay.**

HCS also has a sliding fee scale, which means the amount owed will be calculated based on patient status and serviced rendered. Patients may self-attest to annual income amounts in order to determine patient status.

Fees may be paid in cash or check (made out to SJC Health) only. Currently we are not able to accept payment via credit card or debit card.
