7th Grade AVID

The 7th-grade AVID class put their collaborative skills into action with the annual Life Saver Mini Go Kart Project. Students individually researched past go-kart designs that made use of similar materials: card stock, straws, toothpicks, life savers, and a minimal amount of tape. They then sketched design ideas and pitched them to their group. Groups chose their design, sketched their plans, and wrote out step-by-step instructions. Their task was to follow their blueprints to produce two identical and functional go-karts.

The go-karts are propelled by a fan at the starting line of the race track. They are graded on their: collaboration & their ability to successfully race *both* karts across the finish line of the 8-foot-long race track. Then, for glory and honor (and just for fun), we race the go-karts head to head. This year's winning go-kart was designed and built by Victoria Zarate Tadeo, Olive Uri, & Olsen Schultz.





